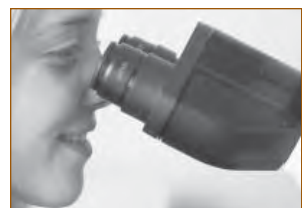

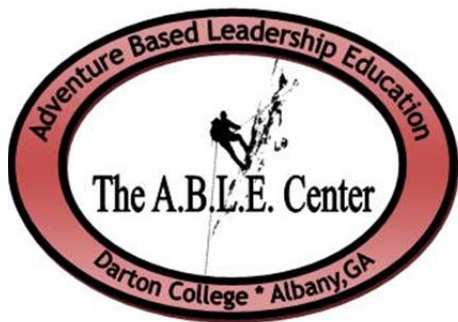

Fee: \$130.00

Early drop off and/or late pick-up: is available at additional cost. No camper may be dropped off unattended. We will provide a staff to supervise. Early drop offs can be made at the Student Center between 8:15-8:44 and late pick-up begins at 5:16-5:45. The fee is **\$35** for the week. Parents will be billed if there is an unplanned early or late pick-up or drop.

Location: Campers are to be dropped off and picked up in the Student Center lobby. They will be met by an A.B.L.E. Center staff member and supervised until picked-up. Activities will occur all over campus and occasionally off campus as announced.

Waiver and Medical Form: Each camper must provide a completed waiver and medical history form before attending camp. This form must be signed by the camper's custodial guardian (You can't sign for your neighbor's kid.)



Meals: Campers must pack a lunch or bring money to purchase lunch at our dining facility. Average meals may cost between \$5.50-\$8.00. There are lots of good choices.

Water: Cold water will be readily available throughout the day. Each participant should bring a bottle that can be refilled each day.

Cooling Off: Activities will be schedule to provide times for cooling off in an AC building from time to time, however, participants should expect to be outside and active most of the day.

Over night Family Campout: On Friday evening at 5:30, parents and family are invited to join us on the Darton College Challenge Course. We will host a pot luck style dinner for our campers and their families. We ask that you bring enough food and drinks for your family. There will be group activities and presentations by our campers.

That night families are invited to stay and camp with us on the challenge course. It is a well lit, secure area with access to restrooms and the pavilion. You are encouraged to bring your own camping gear, however some may be available on a first come first served basis. We will have a campfire that night so bring your camp chairs; we will provide the marshmallows!

Parents are responsible for the supervision of any juvenile non-campers that they bring. Please only bring immediate family as our resources are limited.

While camping at the Darton College facility, alcohol, tobacco products and, firearms are prohibited.

You must depart the facility by **10:30 am on Saturday morning.**
