Police who will then notify the President, Vice President for Academic Affairs, Vice President for Business & Financial Services and Vice President for Student Affairs about the crime or emergency.

Security of and Access to Campus Facilities [668.47(a)(2)]

As one of the State’s public institutions of higher education, the college is open to the public. The Admissions and Financial Aid Offices are open 8:00am-6:00pm Monday and Tuesday and 8:00am-5:00pm Wednesday through Friday. Administrative offices are closed Saturday, Sunday and holidays.

Classes are scheduled 6:30am to 11:15pm Monday through Thursday, 6:30am to 10:15pm Friday and 7:30am to 1:00pm on Saturday.

Library hours are 7:30am to 9:00pm Monday through Thursday, 7:30am to 5:00pm Friday, 2:00pm to 6:00pm on Sunday and 8:00am to 5:00pm Monday through Friday during semester breaks.

Campus Law Enforcement and Prompt Reporting of Campus Crimes [668.47 (a)(3)(i)(ii)]

In addition to the campus police, the college contracts with private security for 24-hour security coverage. Students, employees and visitors are encouraged to promptly report all campus crimes to campus police and/or security officers.

Possession, Use or Sale of Alcoholic Beverages and Illegal Drugs; Drug and Alcohol Abuse [668.47 (a)(9)(10)(11)]
